



REPAIR STAND AMBASSADOR / BICYCLE MECHANIC (SUMMER JOB!)

Status: Limited Term Employment, Jun 14th - Aug 20th, up to 25 hours per week, including paid training.

Rolling interviews will be held beginning in March/April.

Rate: \$10/hr during training. Rate increases to \$13 after training. Up to additional \$0.50 every 2 weeks if goals met.

Location: PEAK Initiative at Tiefenthaler Park, 2480 W Cherry St. Milwaukee, WI 53205, but training provided at North Division High School, 1011 W Center St. Milwaukee, WI 53206

Description: The Stand Ambassador reports to the Lead Mechanic and oversees the new bike repair station and related programming in Tiefenthaler Park. They are trained on repair basics by the Lead Mechanic and expected to work mostly independently for much of the summer, with remote support provided as needed. In coordination with the Lead Mechanic, they work to activate the station by developing and hosting a calendar of events at its location, committing to a multi-day weekly schedule for which they are primarily responsible for the duration of the employment term. This may include workshops on basic bike maintenance, attended hours where they monitor and assist community members in performing their own repairs at the stand, and distribution of safety equipment and literature.

Responsibilities

- Ensure working condition and proper usage of bike repair station
- Demonstrate and teach basic bicycle repairs, assisting others as needed
- Develop, hold a schedule of, and track data for hosted events relevant to bike repair and safety
- Provide good customer service
- Maintain a focus on safety for self and others, in both tool usage and COVID protocol
- Keep inventory of tools/parts on hand, and communicate needs to Lead Mechanic to ensure adequate stock
- Help team to meet program goals for budget and outreach/events

Requirements

- 16 years of age or older and able to legally work in Wisconsin
- Be able to work and problem solve independently but ask for support when needed
- Value working with and teaching a diverse group of people
- Physically fit to lift 30+ pounds several times per day
- Available to be at Tiefenthaler Park for the employment term, staying committed to drafted schedule
- Good communication skills with both colleagues and patrons

Perks

- Earn a bike, lock, and lights at the end of training
- Work outside and stay fit
- Learn a marketable skill
- Receive discounts on bike parts and tools
- Interact with a broad population of Milwaukee residents
- Make a positive impact in the community
