



MOBILE BIKE REPAIR - ASSISTANT BICYCLE MECHANIC (SUMMER JOB!)

Status: Limited Term Employment, May 31st - Aug 12th, up to 25 hours per week, including paid training. Rolling interviews will be held beginning in March/April. Full employment decision made after training.

Rate: \$10/hr during training. Rate increases to \$11.50 after training. \$0.25 increase every two weeks if goals met.

Location: Based out of North Division High School, 1011 W Center St. Milwaukee, WI 53206, or 187 E Becher St. Milwaukee, WI 53207 but provides service at locations in 53204, 53205, 53206, 53215, and adjacent ZIP codes.

Description: The Assistant Mechanic reports to and works under supervision of the Lead Mechanic, performing job duties both independently and in tandem with other Assistant Mechanics. They help diagnose bikes' mechanical problems, perform necessary maintenance and repairs for community members, and collect demographic information from those seeking services from the repair team.

Responsibilities

- Repair all types of bicycles
- Track program outcomes and data
- Provide good customer service
- Maintain a focus on safety for self and others, in both tool usage and COVID protocol
- Keep inventory of materials at beginning and end of work day
- Help team to meet program goals for budget and outreach/events

Requirements

- 16 years of age or older and able to legally work in Wisconsin
- Demonstrate continuing willingness to learn bike mechanic skills
- Be able to work on your own and with small groups
- Value working with and teaching a diverse group of people
- Physically fit to lift 30+ pounds and bike several miles per day
- In town and available to meet repair team at North Division or on site for the majority of summer
- Exercise good communication skills (Bilingual English/Spanish a plus!)
