

## Nick Meyer - Eau Claire





- President of Team Wisconsin Cycling a competitive race team that consists of riders throughout Southeast Wisconsin and Northern Illinois.




#### 2023 Income \$1,438,391

## **Advocacy Report**

#### Priority Projects

- Five of the Bike Fed's 2023 Priority Projects received funding:
  - East Troy Multi-Use Connector Walworth County
  - Highway 67 Underpass Completion Waukesha County
  - Mound View Park Connector Grant County
  - Stewart Tunnel Green County
  - Wisconsin Recreational River Bridge Sauk & DaneCounties
  - Wisconsin River Trail Grant County

#### • Council of Advocates Quarterly Meetings

- 86 advocates from 59 Counties
- Met quarterly to share project updates, advocacy initiatives, informative presenters and speakers



## **Advocacy Report Cont.**

#### Lobby Day

- Thursday, March 8th, 2023; State Capitol
- 60+ advocates from all around the state attended despite some terrible weather!
  - Council of Advocates members
  - Trek & Bike Fed employees including Trek CEO John Burke!
  - Madison Bikes
- Lobbied legislators to support TAP funding in Wisconsin
  - Provided legislators with 3 "one-pager" handouts

#### • Letter-Writing Campaign with Trek

- Launched in the first week of May
- Concluded at the end of Bike Week 2023 (mid-June)
- 1500 letters were sent to state legislators

## East Troy Multi-Use Connector Trail

#### Walworth County

- Received over \$4 million in TAP funding in 2022
- Awarded \$1,189,468 for the completion of this project in 2023
- Will provide safe off-road access between the East Troy Village Square, Mill Pond Park, and the nearly 450 households and businesses located on Honey Creek Road



## Highway 67 Tunnel

Waukesha County

 Completed construction in December 2023!

Open to the public



## Mound View Connector

#### **Grant County**

- Received \$406,816 in TAP funding in 2023 towards the completion of Phase 1
- The connector will add to the regional trail network by linking to Mound View State Trail providing access to more than 250 miles of trail



## Stewart Tunnel

#### **Green County**

- Part of the Badger State Trail, it was closed for years due to a large flooding event in 2018
- Governor Evers included \$6.6 million for Stewart Tunnel repairs in his 2023-2025 Capital Budget recommendation
- The Joint Finance Committee in the Wisconsin State Legislature later approved the \$6.6 million dollars in the state budget.



# Wisconsin Recreational River Bridge Dane & Sauk Counties

- The Wisconsin Recreational River Bridge will connect two of Wisconsin's scenic trails – the Great Sauk State Trail and the Walking Iron Trail – via a 500-foot bridge over the Wisconsin River
- The project was awarded \$5,587,672 in 2023 TAP funding towards the completion of this bridge project.
- With large contributions from Dane County, Sauk County, and the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs already secured, construction is set to begin in 2025



## Wisconsin River Trail

#### **Grant County**

- The Wisconsin River Trail is a project that will create a 20+ mile, non-motorized hiking/biking trail through the Driftless areas of rural Boscobel, Woodman, and Wauzeka, following both sides of the Wisconsin River.
- The project was awarded \$2,069,460
   in 2023 TAP funding towards the completion of Phase 2
- Phase two will create a 7-mile trail from Boscobel to Woodman, following WIS 133 and local roadways

## **Education - Dane County**

- 578 kids directly served
  - → 471 on bikes and 107 walking.
- 13 schools/community centers served
- 2 Adventure Bike Camps
- Bike Valet at 6 UW Badgers games
- Partnered with Wheels for Winners, Dream Bikes, FB4K Madison, Centro Hispano, Lussier Community Center on bike repair and education



#### **Youth Education: Milwaukee**

- 2001 kids directly served:
  - ➤ 1739 in MPS
    - 631 Bikes
    - 75 Child Friendly Cities
    - 1033 Walking Wisdom
  - > 262 in other Summer Bike Programs
    - Across 18 groups
- 17 schools/community centers served
- 230 bikes donated to MPS students









131 communities served

193 volunteer trishaw pilots trained gave over 940 rides

6 new locations with trishaws over 25 emerging locations

#### MilWALKee Walks

- Held 60 Crosswalk Actions across Milwaukee to bring attention to Yield to Pedestrians law - over 320 volunteer hours and hundreds of signs!
- Collaboration with AARP WI and Amani residents to install traffic calming
- Collaboration and input with the City and County on their Vision Zero and traffic calming efforts
- Received expanded funding to work throughout Milwaukee County and hire part time staff!




#### **Teaching Safe Bicycling and PSAs**

- TSB in Whitefish Bay, Madison, Eau Claire, Menasha, Cottage Grove, and Madison.
- QR code trail signs in Milwaukee along Beer Line and a County Parks trail
- Billboards in Milwaukee, Waukesha, Dane, and Fox Valley/Green Bay with over 2.6 Million impressions
- ❖ 475 Yard signs handed out with "Give 3 Feet" messaging
- Radio PSA "Lights ON, Slow Down, Look Around" 500K+ reach
- "Give 3 feet" video PSA ran around the state on Spectrum NEWS1
- Ped Safety messaging: 8 billboards in MKE, 400 yard signs, 40K Social Impressions
- Adult Learn to Ride and Smart Cycling 101 to 100+ underserved residents



## Mobile Bike Repair



- Milwaukee employed two youth mechanics to fix 300+ bikes at 20+ locations. Worked with a local HS to facilitate service learning and a self-supported bikepacking trip.
- Madison- events at 8 bike repair stands, fixed 134 bikes and gave safety messages to 392 people and gave away dozens of lights, locks, and water bottles.
- Green Bay partnered with Green Bay Bicycle Collective who fixed 58 bikes at 10 locations
